#### **Little Wallabies Topic Update**

Little Wallabies have been busy learning through sensory play; in sand and water, mixing and mark making using basic shapes. Little Wallabies will be exploring the three primary colours, red, blue and yellow in their sensory play. Suggestion: Please also discuss and point out these three colours while at home and about with your child?

### **General Topics Update**

- Throughout the nursery we will be using 'Letters and Sounds' to support the children's learning from introducing sounds in the environment in Little Wallabies and Explorers to focusing on set 1 sounds in Big Kangas: s, a, t, p for the next few weeks. - The Big Kangas will be learning about **animals**, their habitats and foods they eat. This week we learnt about insects. Please see the photo of our children on a **bug hunt** in our wonderful garden.
- Little Explorers are also focusing on maths.
  They are counting objects and recognising numbers in their play, matching number symbols to quantities. Suggestion:- To reinforce their learning please could you continue this at home. Activities such as number songs and counting objects at home, such as steps and pointing out numbers, i.e. bus, door numbers.
