

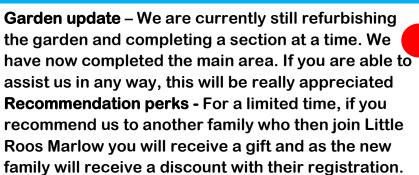
## **Little Roos Newsletter**

Little Wallabies have been taking part in different sensory activities. They have been exploring different textures using their hands and feet. Whilst doing these activities the children have been able to explore a variety of resources ranging from paint, bubble wrap, sand and water.

Little Explorers have been looking at different types of technology that we use in the nursery, such as cameras, recordable devices and remote control toys. They were then given the opportunity to take photos by themselves. We have also been looking at our emotions and feelings to build and develop our Personal, Social and Emotional skills.

Big Kangas have recently been taking part in different science activities. They have been experimenting with different materials seeing the reactions when they mix solutions together. They have been using keywords such as oily, slimy, solid, float, sink, melting. See picture above.
